ACTUAL: This compares income vs. expenses. We'd like to fund everything according to budget, but we try not to spend what we haven't received yet.

REMEMBER: Tithe, though doing a vital work, goes to our local Conference and doesn't cover any of our expenses. Those come out of Church Budget. So let's make the Church Budget as regular a part of our giving as tithe. We believe God will bless us for it.



NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

Angela Kraft Cross is an organist, pianist, and composer in the Bay Area of California. She earned her Bachelor's degrees in Physics and Organ Performance in Oberlin College and Conservatory of Music in 1980, then her Doctor of Medicine at Loma Linda University where she did a residency in ophthalmology. In 1993 she completed her Master of Music in Piano Performance at College of Notre Dame. The major composition to be played in worship today is in direct result of the influence of Dr. Wil Alexander, Chaplain and Professor of Religion at Loma Linda University, who shaped so many in the medical profession. In a school whose motto is To make Man Whole, Uncle Wil personified whole person care, and even into his nineties made daily rounds with medical teams to teach empathy and spiritual care. Quoting Ms. Cross, "He had an enormous impact on my approach to being a physician."

Journey to Wholeness is a story of illness, empathy, and healing. While this major work is written for a large concert instrument, hopefully with the help of registrants our organ can give this composition a variation of what it would be on a massive instrument. Three movements encompass Ms. Cross's vision, beginning with the aspect of becoming ill, understanding empathy in the second movement, to Healing in the third movement. Themes contrast what occurs when illness is evident, to knowing a kind and generous caregiver, to understanding a first failed attempt at a quick recovery, but finally after another visit from the Empathy theme, true healing commences and is accomplished on many levels.
