**REBIRTH 21:** This loan was for repairs and renovations such as the kitchen, the ramp, and the sanctuary sound system. Donations to repay this loan are separate from church budget giving. Our outstanding balance is \$184,609.76.

**REMEMBER:** Tithe, though doing a vital work, all goes to our local Conference and does not cover any of our expenses. Those come out of Church Budget. So let's make the Church Budget as regular a part of our giving as tithe. We believe God will bless us for it.

# Women's History Spotlight

Amy Beach was a New England born composer and the first American woman to have a symphony published and performed by a major orchestra, the Boston Symphony. She began her career as a composer and pianist and was well known for her concerts featuring her own works. Beach was somewhat of a prodigy-by the age of one it is said she could accurately sing 40 songs, and by age two was able to harmonize with counter-melody. She married a surgeon, who made her agree to "live according to his status, that is, function as a society matron and patron of the arts." She had to quit teaching lessons and was limited to only two public recitals a year, where profits had to be donated to charity. After her marriage she began to focus on composition because of all the mandates of her husband. Much of her writing technique was self taught because Dr. Beach did not think it proper for his wife to have a tutor or take class. After her husband's death, Beach went to Europe, jumpstarted her career, and began to publish under her name Amy Beach instead of Mrs. H.H.A. Beach. Her music is celebrated in New England and throughout the world.
