BUDGET: Our 2020 church budget is \$392,000 to cover our ministries, SLA subsidy, building maintenance, and operating expenses.

ACTUAL: This compares income vs. expenses. We'd like to fund everything according to budget, but we try not to spend what we haven't received yet.

REBIRTH 21: This loan was for repairs and renovations such as the kitchen, the ramp, and the sanctuary sound system. Donations to repay this loan are separate from church budget giving. Our outstanding balance is \$184,609.76.

REMEMBER: Tithe, though doing a vital work, all goes to our local Conference and does not cover any of our expenses. Those come out of Church Budget. So let's make the Church Budget as regular a part of our giving as tithe. We believe God will bless us for it.

Women's History Spotlight

Melanie Bonis, known as Mel Bonis, was a late-romantic French composer. She attended the Paris Conservatory and studied with César Franck and Ernest Guiraud. Bonis was born to a lower-class Catholic family. She taught herself piano, and when her parents recognized that she had a gift for music they convinced a professor at the conservatory to start formal lessons at the age of 12. Bonis shared her formal classes at the conservatory with Claude Debussy, and her tuition was sponsored by Franck. She soon adopted the more androgynous name of Mel for her compositions to try to avoid some of the difficulties faced by women composers. Bonis wrote more than 300 works for various ensembles, piano solo, four hands, organ, chamber music, songs, choral works, a mass, and orchestral works.
