BUDGET: Our 2024 church budget is \$425,000 to cover our ministries, SLA subsidy, building maintenance, and operating expenses.

ACTUAL: This compares income vs. expenses. We'd like to fund everything according to budget, but we try not to spend what we haven't received yet.

REMEMBER: Tithe, although vital, goes to our local conference and it does not cover any of our expenses. Those come out of church budget. Let's make the church budget as regular a part of our giving as tithe. God will bless us for it.

Our 2024 Local Church Budget is \$425,000, and that breaks down to \$35,417/month. You may wonder where do those dollars go? Here are a few examples: Each month CC sends \$10,294 to help operate SLA for its 283 students; last Sabbath approximately 175 of us enjoyed a beautiful Sabbath at Camp Winnekeag and a wonderful meal in the cafeteria thanks to our Local Church Budget; we purchase Sabbath School magazines for our kids; we heat and cool our building with utility costs of several thousand dollars each month; we helped our Pathfinders attend the Believe the Promise Camporee in Wyoming; ran a VBS that blessed many children; are gearing up for tomorrow's Choose Wellness Fair in Sterling, MA; purchased new mics for our sound system; enjoyed a delicious hot breakfast this morning in our fellowship hall; printed this bulletin; and much, much more. To sum it up: Many lives are blessed thanks to our Local Church Budget. Please continue to support our Local Church Budget in your stewardship planning.


HARD OF HEARING? Try an assisted listening device from the sound booth in the back of the sanctuary. Bring your headphones to connect (needs standard headphone jack).
