ACTUAL: This compares income vs. expenses. We'd like to fund everything according to budget, but we try not to spend what we haven't received yet.

REBIRTH 21: This loan was for repairs and renovations such as the kitchen, the ramp, and the sanctuary sound system. Donations to repay this loan are separate from church budget giving. Our outstanding balance is \$189,771.71.

REMEMBER: Tithe, though doing a vital work, all goes to our local Conference and does not cover any of our expenses. Those come out of Church Budget. So let's make the Church Budget as regular a part of our giving as tithe. We believe God will bless us for it.



BLACK HISTORY MUSIC SPOTLIGHT

English composer and conductor, Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, began his musical life as a violinist. He began studying at the age of 15 at the Royal College of Music. Taylor changed his focus from violin to composition, and following graduation he was appointed as a professor at the Crystal Palace school of music. His music was becoming widely popular in England and the United States, touring the states three times. On his first tour, Taylor was received by President Roosevelt at the White House, a rarity for an African-American man at that time. He wanted to incorporate traditional African music into classical music, much like with Brahms and Hungarian music, and Dvorak with Bohemian music. Taylor died at 37, but he left behind a large catalogue of works that continue to be popular today.
