QUICK SUMMARY: Good news: Our utility expenses dropped a bit this month compared to last month; our loan balance has dropped slightly; and our elevator fund balance has more than doubled in the past month. The bad news is that our deficit grew, so please prayerfully consider how we can all help change this trend as we enter the summer months.

TITHE, although vital, goes to the SNEC and **does not cover any of our expenses**. Those come out of church budget. Let's make the church budget as regular a part of our giving as tithe. You can donate in the offering boxes by the sanctuary doors, or at <u>wearecc.net/give</u>. *Pastor Einar*

Our 2025 church budget is \$427,250. This funds all local ministries, expenses, and our support of SLA. We also voted to install an elevator. We've added an Elevator Project Fund donation line in Adventist Giving, and you can write that on the tithe envelopes. Please prayerfully consider how you can help make this need a reality. It would also be wise to reduce our debt. We'd like to see it reduced to \$100,000 and our Elevator Fund grow to \$100,000 by Dec. 31. The elevator will cost around \$200,000.




